




SUPPLY PICK-UP



VIRTUAL ACTING CLASSES

Grades 1st-3rd: Jr. Detectives: Mystery Archives

Calling all Jr. Detectives! The game's afoot! We've unlocked the door to the *Mystery Archives*. We need your help solving the mystery hiding within the pages of our books.

Students will use their voices, bodies, and imaginations to uncover clues hidden within familiar storybooks. At the end of our eight week session, we'll put the clues together to uncover a secret message in their final showcase!

Mondays, October 5-November 23, 3-4pm (\$160)

Grades 3rd-5th: Who's Mystery is it Anyway???

Learn the foundations of developing a strong character, given circumstances, and objectives as you improv your way through solving a mystery of your own! This class is all about improv, skill building, and fun.

In this eight week session, we will focus on the basic building blocks of improv in order to equip students with the tools they need tmo create improvised scenes in their final showcase: *Mysteries from a Hat.*

Tuesdays, October 6-November 24, 3-4:30pm (\$190)

Grades 6-8th: The Mystery Monologues

Everyone has motive. Everyone has opportunity. The question is: Whodunnit? In this class, students will have the opportunity to develop a charcter from scratch and create a monologue for their character that will serve as their alibi in the case of a stolen work of art. They'll perform their alibis in our final showcase where it will be up to the audience to decide: whodunnit. Every mystery has a twist: our students won't know who the culprit is until the end of the showcase.
